Valentine's greetings, Faith Journey family!

February is a month in which greeting card companies and chocolatiers would like us all to think ooey, gooey, sentimental thoughts, and open our pocketbooks accordingly. And, while romantic love is certainly and important for human flourishing, it's not central to faith or trust in God's love for humankind.

Greek has three different words that can be translated as love. The first is eros, which is romantic love. The second is phileos, which is the love between siblings (brothers) or friends. The third is agape, which is selfless/self-sacrificing love; the kind of love we see most clearly shown in Jesus.

Our theme for the season of Lent, which begins on February 18th, is Near to the Heart of God. During the season of Lent, a large three-dimensional heart will adorn the center of the cross at the front of the sanctuary. Throughout the Lenten season, we will reflect together on the nature of God's love for us and the grace God shows us in Jesus.

Our Lenten midweek worship series is Keepers of the Truth and will focus on five themes from chapters 13-17 of John's gospel: Love, Hope, Friendship, Companionship, and Prayer.

BCE (BELL CHOIR EAST) VS. BCW (BELL CHOIR WEST)

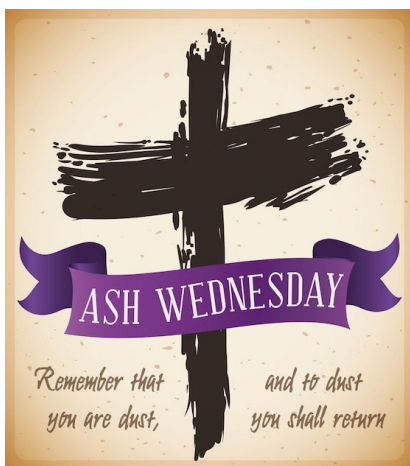

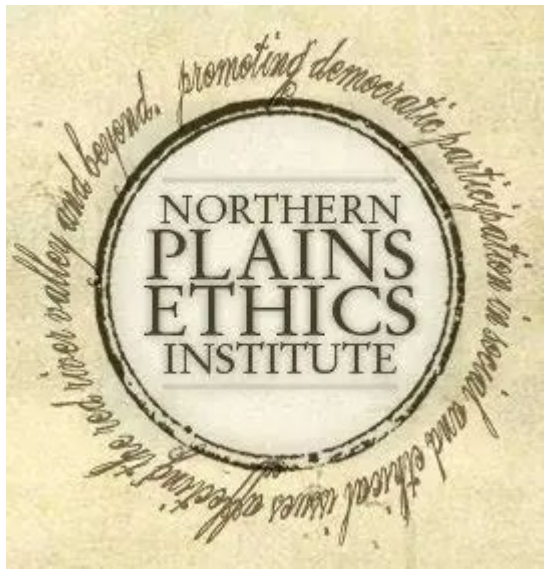

The Northern Plains Ethics Institute (NPEI) at North Dakota State University announces its upcoming Noon Luncheon event on Thursday, February 19, 2026, featuring distinguished historian of science Edward B. (Ted) Davis. His presentation, titled “Why Christianity is Good for Science,” examines the relationship between Christian thought & scientific inquiry.

Topic: “Why Christianity is Good for Science”

Talk Overview: A vocal group of contemporary scientists & commentators-often labeled “New Atheists” – portray science & Christianity as fundamentally opposed. In this talk, Davis

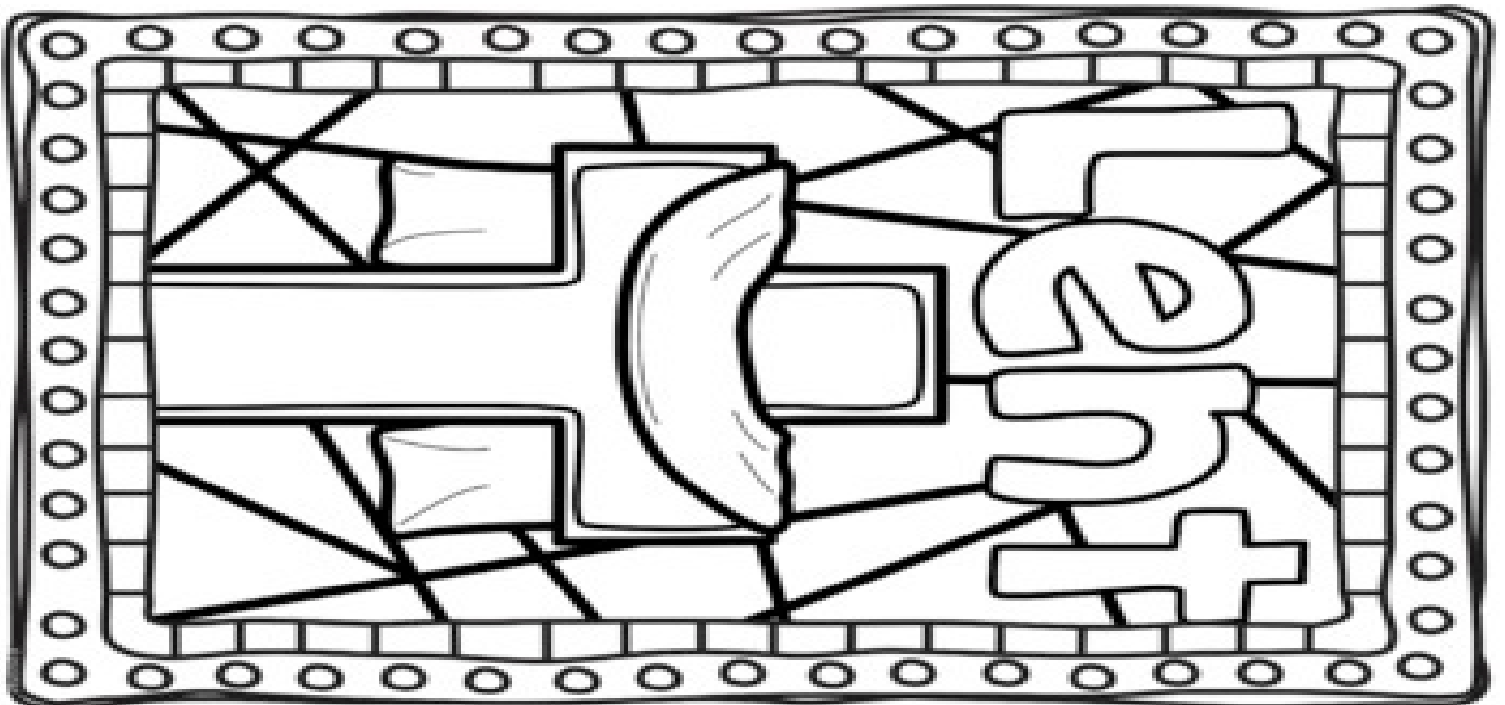
challenges that assumption. Drawing on the history & philosophy of science, he argues that Christian theological ideas, particularly the doctrine of creation, historically supported scientific curiosity & provided motivation for investigating nature.

About the speaker: Edward B. (Ted) Davis is Professor Emeritus of the History of Science at Messiah University, Affiliate Fellow in the Department of the History of Science, Technology, & Medicine at the University of Oklahoma, & a Fellow of the International Society for Science & Religion. He studied physics at Drexel University before completing a Ph.D. in the history & philosophy of science at Indiana University. Davis taught courses on the history of science from Plato to Newton, Darwin & evolution, Galileo, the human dimensions of science, & the origins controversy in America. His lectures on “The Scientific Revolution: Its Classical & Christian History” are available from ClassicalU. His research has appeared on BBC Radio, & he has advised exhibits at the National Museum of American History & the Museum of the Bible.

His latest book, Protestant Modernist Pamphlets: Science & Religion in the Scopes Era, was published in 2024 by Johns Hopkins University Press. Davis has lectured internationally, speaking at nearly 100 institutions on 5 continents.
